## DEKALB COUNTY STATE'S ATTORNEY CLAY CAMPBELL

April 15, 2011

Dear Parents and Seniors:

At this time of year, many of you are planning and organizing graduation activities. Frequently, the State's Attorney's Office is asked about the various laws that regulate the consumption of alcohol. I hope the following information provides some guidance and direction for you and your families to have a safe and joyful celebration within the law.

It is unlawful:

- To give, sell or deliver alcohol to anyone under the age of 21
- For anyone under the age of 21 to purchase, consume or possess alcohol
- For a parent or guardian to allow his/her residence to be used by persons under the age of 21 to consume alcohol
- For anyone over the age of 21 to allow a person under the age of 21 to use his/her identification for the purpose of buying or drinking alcohol
- For anyone under the age of 21 to present false or altered identification in order to purchase alcohol or to have such identification in his/her possession
- For anyone, regardless of age, to have any alcohol in his/her possession on any public street, sidewalk, parkway or other public place
- To knowingly allow a gathering of two or more persons under the age of 21 where such underage persons possess or consume alcohol and leave the residence in an intoxicated condition
- To rent a hotel room for the purpose of or knowing that the room will be used by persons under the age of 21 to drink alcohol
- For anyone under the age of 21 to drive a vehicle with **any** amount of alcohol in his/her system

Some of these offenses carry penalties up to \$2,500.00 and include the possibility of jail time. Underage persons will have their driver's license suspended by the Secretary of State if they drive with any amount of alcohol in their system or use or possess false identification. Older brothers or sisters could also have their license suspended if a younger sibling uses their license or identification.

For students, the feelings of youthful invincibility quickly vanish when an avoidable tragedy involving alcohol occurs. For parents, the best party does not include serving alcohol. Most parents provide safe and healthy activities for students that do not include alcohol. According to the DeKalb-Sycamore Study 2000, most kids drink beverages other than alcohol at parties.

Congratulations to all our graduates and to the parents that supported them along the way!

As a freshman Moore made the Varsity team at Richards High school in Oak Lawn, IL.
