MLA Citations (Revised in 2009)

A Book by a Single Author

Book citations remain largely the same except for the addition of the medium of publication, Print, at the end of the entry.

Author Last Name, First Name. *Book Title*. Pub. Location: Publisher, Year. Medium.

Fitzgerald, F. Scott. *The Great Gatsby*. New York: Charles Scribner's Sons, 2004. Print.

Article in a Scholarly Journal

Regardless of pagination, all scholarly publication citations include both volume and issue numbers. End citations with the medium of publication, Print.

Author Last Name, First Name. "Article Title." *Journal Name* Vol #: Pages. Medium.

Bios 23.1 (1952): 26-35. Print.

Article, poem, or short story in an Anthology (Like your literature book)

Author Last Name, First Name. "Article, Poem or Short Story Name." *Name of the Anthology*.

Editor's Name. Pub. Location: Publisher, Year. Medium.

More, Hannah. "The Black Slave Trade: A Poem." *British Women Poets of the Romantic Era*. Ed. Paula R. Feldman. Baltimore: John Hopkins UP, 1997. 472 – 82.
Print.

A Government Publication

An Article in a Newspaper

Author Last, First. "Article Title." *Newspaper Name* Day Month Year of Publication, edition if necessary: page number. Medium

Jeromack, Paul. "This Once, a David of the Art World Does Goliath a Favor." *New York Times* 13 July 2002, late ed.: B7+. Print.

A Film or Video Recording

Title. Dir. First Last name. Distributor, year of distribution. Medium.

It's A Wonderful Life. Dir. Frank Capra. RKO, 1946. Film.

A Specific Song

Artist's Last Name, Artist's First Name. "Song Title." *Album Name*. Music Producer. Year. Medium.

Ex. Counting Crows. "Mr. Jones." *August and Everything After*. DGC, 1993. CD.

A Television Program

"Title of Episode if any." *Title of the series*. Name of Network. Broadcast date. Medium.

"One about the Monkey." *Friends*. National Broadcasting Company. 6 Feb. 2009. Television.

Online Article

Online periodicals include both the name of the website in italics and the website publisher. Note that some sites will have different names than their print formats, such as ones that include a domain name like .com or .org. If no publisher is listed, use N.p. to denote no publisher name given. Follow with date of publication, Web as medium of publication, and date of access.

“Article, Poem or Short Story Name.” *Website Name*. Website Owner, Last Update.

Medium. Access Date. <Full Internet Address>.
